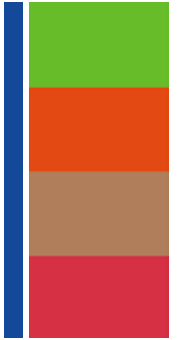


Finding a Younger Member Group

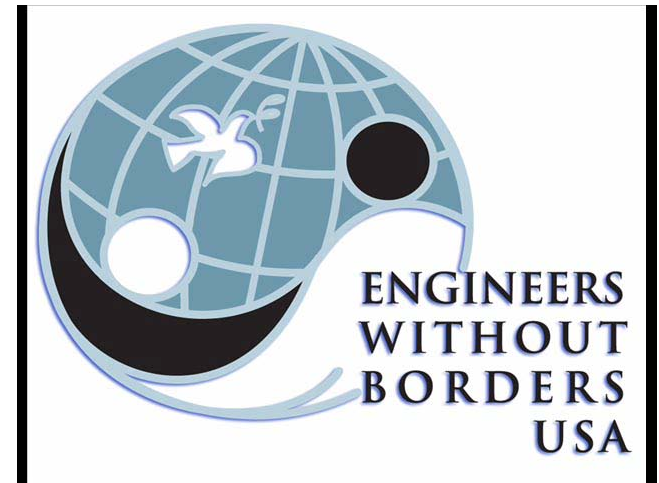
- Younger Member Groups (or Forums / Committees) are part of a Section or Branch

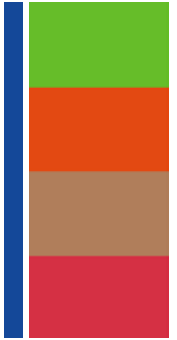

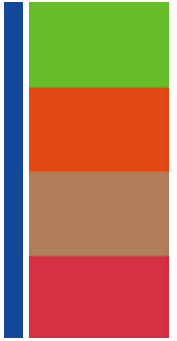

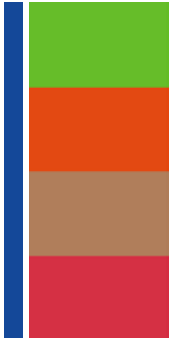

- ~\$55 million budget



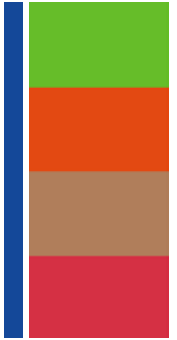

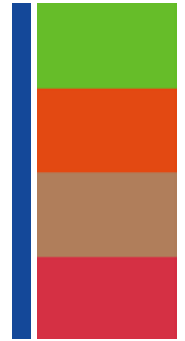
