Dear Lafayette Leopards Family:

The 2021-22 school year was a welcome return to normal for Lafayette athletics as the effects of the pandemic waned and our student-athletes and coaches faced fewer interruptions to the daily routine.

It was certainly a year of transition, as we welcomed five new head coaches into the Lafayette ranks. **John Troxell '94** returned home to College Hill where he had already been a Patriot League champion as a student-athlete and assistant coach. Trox brought with him 16 years of head coaching experience that included nine postseason appearances at Franklin and Marshall.

Another Leopard alum, **A.J. Miller '11**, took over the baseball program. A.J. was the Patriot League player of the year in his senior season and played professionally before getting into coaching. Miller spent seven years on the staff at Lehigh as an assistant coach, recruiting coordinator and associate head coach.

Mike Jordan took over as the men's basketball head coach, replacing Fran O'Hanlon who retired after 27 seasons. Mike, like Coach O, had vast international playing experience before jumping into coaching. The 2000 Penn graduate and member of the school's athletics hall of fame was an assistant coach at Colgate for eight seasons and Drexel for one, helping guide the programs to three NCAA Tournaments.

We also brought on a new head softball coach in Karavin Dew. Karavin is a 2013 graduate of Western Kentucky who had five previous coaching stops. Most recently, she was an assistant coach at Tennessee State, where she helped the team set a mark for its most wins since 2014.

In the competition realm, Lafayette student-athletes earned four conference major awards in 2021-22. Volleyball enjoyed unprecedented success, claiming its most wins in league history. **Leanna Deegan '22** led the nation in kills and points per set, while



claiming Patriot League Player of the Year honors and head coach Ryan Adams was the Patriot League Coach of the Year, the first conference major awards in Lafayette volleyball history. In men's golf, **Ryan Tall '22** was the Patriot League Golfer of the Year and qualified for the NCAA New Haven Regional. In field hockey, **Audrey Sawers '22** was the Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year while **Lineke Spaans '25** was the conference Rookie of the Year.

In the classroom, our student-athletes continued to excel—ranked first in the nation in 2021-22 in the NCAA's Graduation Success Rate, a measure that validates our primary educational mission at the College. Additionally, several were able to broaden their leadership experiences by attending the Black Student-Athlete Summit and the NCAA Career in Sports Forum.

Financially, we have continued to move forward with fundraising for our athletics priorities. Those efforts have been buoyed by lead gifts from **Andrew '95** and **Dina '95 Wallach** for the Wallach Sports Performance and Lacrosse Center and by **Peter Gummesson '80** for the Gummesson Grounds that will transform Lafayette's soccer venue.

I am glad to share this annual update with you and I thank you for your continued support in strengthening our culture and community. We have a lot to be excited about, yet there is still plenty of work to be done as we continue Climbing the Hill together. Thank you for all that you do in helping us to support our student-athletes.

CREATING A CHAMPIONSHIP CULTURE

STRATEGIC GOAL 1 Achieve Competitive Excellence

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- ▶ Lafayette volleyball set a program record for conference victories while also earning its best seed ever in the Patriot League Tournament guided by the Patriot League Coach of the Year Ryan Adams and the Player of the Year Leanna Deegan '22.
- ▶ Ryan Tall earned medalist honors at the Patriot League golf championships and represented the Maroon and White at the NCAA New Haven Regional.
- ▶ Continued to fund raise and plan for the construction of the Wallach Sports Performance and Lacrosse Center.
- ▶ Received the approval for two new senior level administrators in athletics while promoting several members of the athletic leadership team.



STRATEGIC GOAL 2 Strengthen Academic Excellence

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- ▶ Ranked No. 1 in the nation in the NCAA's Division I annual Graduation Success Rate (GSR) for the second straight year. Lafayette claimed a 99 percent GSR overall for its 22 sports measured. Twenty-one Leopard teams achieved a graduation success rate of 100 percent.
- ▶ Twenty athletic programs finished well above the national average in the NCAA's multi-year Academic Progress Rates, while 16 programs earned perfect scores of 1000.
- ▶ Introduced our third class, a group of 59 student-athletes, who were inducted into Chi Alpha Sigma, a national scholar-athlete society.
- ▶ Established Dean's List Recognition night at basketball games where students are invited for dinner, games, and a court appearance for their accomplishment of earning a 3.6 GPA or higher.
- ▶ Spring 2022 had the highest number of student-athletes earn a perfect 4.0 (61), setting a new department record.

- ▶ Enlisted the services of a nutritionist to work with student-athletes
- ▶ Established several partnerships with sports supplement companies

- ▶ Sponsored three leadership speaking events with Jason Redman

- ▶ Broadcasted 92 out of 112 home events on the Lafayette Sports Network and ESPN+
- ▶ Football broadcasts, including the 157th meeting of Lafayette-Lehigh, were picked up by SNY and various regional NBC Sports affiliates
- ▶ Inducted Jim Dicker '85, Ashley Harbin '08 and Jason McLaughlin '95 into the Maroon Club Hall of Fame
- ▶ Hosted soccer clinic and game at Easton Area High School's Cottingham Stadium
- ▶ Established partnership with CSMG to enhance revenue streams in the areas of advertising/sponsorships, ticket sales, naming rights, and camps.
- ▶ Added a unique partnership with the USGA to promote the 2022 US Senior Open



BRIDGING THE SCHOLARSHIP GAP

While some sports are at their maximum number of scholarships, many are not. In 2017, a group of dedicated alumni contributed \$1 million to establish the **Leopard Champions Scholarship Fund**, a general scholarship for Lafayette athletics. Fundraising, particularly for scholarships, is critical for building a championship culture and enabling student-athletes to compete at the highest level. The Leopard Champions Fund is at the heart of this. But \$1 million is not enough, and this fundraising continues.
